

# The Devil's Myth & End-Time Lie

The graph below, showing the number of baptisms and professions of faith from 2012 to 2019, reveals that God is on the move through his people here in Tasmania. So why the growth trend over the last two to three years? Between 2012 to 2019 members have been very active in reaching the community through personal ministry, small groups, our ADRA shops, Schools, Spring Beach Youth Camp, Pathfinders, Tween Camps, STORMCOS; Health programs, Women's ministry and Literature Evangelism. The main difference since 2017 is that more of our pastors and churches have been increasingly engaged in sharing Jesus in the context of our God-given prophetic messages through Prophecy Seminars, Home Bible studies, Small Groups, and Public Evangelistic meetings.

We are starting to see what happens when, like a rowboat, we use both oars – the sowing oar and the reaping oar – in other words, meeting felt needs and proclaiming Jesus both publicly and from house to house. When churches use only one of the two oars they go around in circles. Using both in a planned and strategic way, as Jesus did, brings growth.

Repeatedly since I began ministry I have heard comments like: "Prophecy seminars and public evangelism doesn't work anymore." Then if a church runs such things, the cry goes up: "we need to nurture our members," which is code for, ""stop doing these things." All of this is just the voice of the devil seeking to halt our work of saving souls eternally. We must nurture members, but we must not stop the proclamation of the word to do it. This was the great temptation the devil tried on the early church, but the Holy Spirit's solution was to appoint deacons and elders to care for the church so the apostles could devote their time to prayer and sharing God's word, and as a result the work went forward (Acts 6:1-7; Titus 1:5).

Ellen White, following the New Testament model, told ministers that their primary work was to preach and teach the word to nonbelievers and to educate members for service: "Do not hover over the churches to repeat over and over again the same truths to the people, while the cities are left in ignorance and sin, unwarned and unlaboured for...Wake up the church members that they may unite in doing a definite and self-denying work" (10 Manuscript Releases p216).

"We must not feel that we are compelled to hover over churches who have received the truth. We are not to spend our time doing detail work, but are to educate others, teaching them how to labour in right lines. We must not encourage the people to depend on ministerial help and labour to preserve spiritual life" (Notebook Leaflets Vol 1, p127)

The church does not have a choice in the matter of house to house and public proclamation evangelism: God commanded Jonah to preach publically in Nineveh; Jesus modelled both house to house and public evangelistic preaching and then commanded His disciples and the church to do it till the end of time; Peter, Paul, Stephen, Philip with many lay members did it; Paul commanded the young pastor, Timothy, to preach evangelistically; God's end-time remnant are specifically told to preach the gospel in a prophetic context; and finally all members are called by Jesus to invite people to come to Him (Jonah 1:2; 3:1-4; Matthew 4:17,23; 9:35; 10:7,17; 24:14; Mark 16:15,20; Acts 2; 7; 8:4,5; 15:36; 17:13; 19:8-10; 2 Timothy 4:1-5; Revelation 10:11; 14:6,7; 22:17). Obedience to Christ is the church's only safe option and the world's greatest need.

# Ordination & Commissioning Of Female Pastors



n light of questions that have come to us in relation to the ordination and commissioning of female gospel ministers, we felt it would be helpful to share the church's official position on such matters, as they currently stand, Please note that it is not the intent of this article to set forth the Biblical reasons for these positions, but merely the official church position.

Firstly, the church at this time does not allow the ordination of women. The 2015 General Conference Session also voted not to allow the church's world divisions to make decisions on women's ordination. Our South Pacific Division, including our Australian Union Conference, have accepted and respected this decision and are not ordaining women to the gospel ministry. The reason for this is based on the following counsel from God to the church through His servant Ellen White:

"I have been shown that no man's judgment should be surrendered to the judgment of any one man. But when the judgment of the General Conference, which is the highest authority that God has upon the earth, is exercised, private independence and private judgment must not be maintained, but surrendered"

(Ellen G White Testimonies for the Church, Vol. 3 p492)

"...God has ordained that the representatives of His church from all parts of the earth, when assembled in a General Conference, shall have authority"

(Ellen G White Testimonies for the Church, Vol. 3 p492)

Secondly, the church does allow the commissioning of female gospel ministers. Following the 2015 General Conference session, General Conference President, Elder Ted Wilson, stated that the action taken at that session to not allow world divisions to make decisions to ordain women, did not disallow women from serving as commissioned church pastors; women from serving as ordained elders in the local church, and the ordination of deaconesses (all of which were decisions made previously by the world church.

There are of course differences between the functions ordained pastors and commissioned pastors can perform. For example, commissioned ministers cannot ordain gospel ministers or organise churches.

However, it should also be noted that official church working policy does allow the title "Pastor" to be applied to a commissioned minister, irrespective of gender, for the simple reason that they are shepherds (pastors) of the flock. In some divisions, all gospel ministers are called "Pastor" even if they are not ordained or commissioned. In our South Pacific Division, which is the General Conference in our part of the world, and as such has to abide by General Conference Working Policy and the Church Manual, commissioned female ministers are also called "Pastor."

Therefore, if you hear commissioned female ministers being called "Pastor" in our Division, Union or our conference, rest assure this is not rebellion against church decisions, but merely following through on what is allowed by the world church.

Finally, there are loyal church members who, from a Biblical viewpoint, believe women should not be ordained, just as there are equally loyal godly church members who, also from a Biblical viewpoint, believe women should be ordained. For now, the world church has decided not to ordain female gospel ministers. In the future, the world church in session may change its mind, but for now, we must all accept the decision not to ordain female gospel ministers, as God's voice.

#### **General Information**

- No electric heaters allowed
- In the interests of hygiene, dogs or other animals are **NOT** permitted on the grounds at any time.
- Valuables should be cared for properly and not left in tents, caravans or rooms unattended. Please ensure that you look after your purses, wallets and mobile phones at all times. No responsibility will be accepted for loss.

All site allocations processed by the Camp Secretary are final. Preference will be given to your selected site, but cannot be guaranteed. Please do not assume you have the same site as last camp.

#### **Camp Regulations – Terms and Conditions**

The purpose of the convention is to build the spiritual life of the church, to seek the power of the Holy Spirit that we may be guided to better serve the Lord. To ensure that this camp will be a blessing to all as we fellowship together and in the interests of safety, practicality and Christian harmony, we solicit your co-operation in the observance of the following simple rules:

#### **Child supervision**

We cannot accept applications from children or youth under the age of 18.

Children/teenagers under the age of 18 must **NEVER** be left on the grounds overnight unsupervised. Every occupied site is to have a responsible **adult person** to ensure that all occupants abide by camp regulations. Failure to adhere to this requirement will forfeit the right to the campsite for the duration for the camp. All overnight campers must be registered with the Camp Office.

Children/Teens 15 years and under are to be with their parents/guardians within one hour of the conclusion of their last meeting for the day or by 10:30pm, whichever comes first.

#### **Child Safety**

Parents are reminded that their responsibility for their children does not cease when they come to camp. While every care is taken, and there are activities for children, camp is not a child minding facility. While we provide as much care as possible the ultimate responsibility for the care of children always remains with parents or guardians.

Please ensure that the conduct of your children and young people is adequately supervised throughout the camp period, and that your children are fully under your control between meetings.

*It is essential* that parents do not assume that their children are safe. Parents need to know *at all times*:

- 1. Where their children are.
- 2. What they are doing.
- 3. Which adult is responsible for their supervision and safety.

#### **Power and furnishings**

Campers are to supply their own tent furnishings. No electric heaters are allowed.

Due to WH&S Standards, the Conference cannot provide any electrical or lighting facilities for the tents. Please bring your own supply of rope, electrical cords and ALL lighting for your site/s. These items must be tested and tagged by a qualified person before camp. Please be aware that you will have limited power available.

Please also bring your own pegs and hammer to peg down your tents in case of windy weather.

#### Behaviour

- 1. The behaviour of those staying on the campground is to be appropriate for a Christian Convention.
- Any electronic musical device or other instrument is to be used in a manner not likely to cause annoyance to neighbours in adjoining sites (cabins, caravans or tents).
- Loud and offensive language is not accepted or tolerated. Offenders will be asked to leave the grounds.

4. Quietness is to be observed between the hours of 10:00pm and 6:00am.

#### **Alcohol and Other Drugs**

As the campground is designated an alcohol, tobacco and drug free environment the following rules apply:

- 1. Alcohol, tobacco and illicit drugs are not to be brought onto the campground. Offenders will forfeit their rights to be on the grounds. Motor vehicles used to bring alcohol, tobacco or illicit drugs onto the campground will be refused further admittance to the campground for the duration of camp.
- 2. If it is found that alcohol, tobacco or illicit drugs are being consumed at a particular campsite, then all occupants of that site will be required to vacate and forfeit all rights to the site, and will not be allowed to use the site again for the duration of the camp.
- 3. Police will be notified if illicit drugs are found on the campground.

#### **Mobile Phones**


Out of courtesy for others and to save interrupting the meeting and causing a distraction, all mobile phones should be turned off or set to silent mode during the meetings.

#### **Vehicle Access and Speed Limits**

A new road has been created across the paddock. Therefore all access will be via Thompsons Rd. (See map on next page)

ALL CARS must be parked in the new car park in the paddock. No cars will be allowed to park permanently, or drive regularly, in the tent or caravan areas. THIS IS A SAFETY REQUIREMENT. Vehicles will be allowed in accommodation areas only to load and unload. On the last Sabbath of camp NO access will be allowed to the camping areas until after the close of Sabbath.

A strict speed limit of 5 kms/hr will be enforced. This is approximately walking pace.



# **Transforming Grace Women's Retreat**

Women from across the state were recently blessed by participating in our annual Adventist Women's Retreat held over the weekend of 18-20th of October at Spring Beach Youth Camp. This year our theme was 'Transforming Grace,' which we explored through Bible studies, devotionals, practical grace stations, 'I AM' scriptural promises, personal testimonies and a service project.

Recognition of the evidence of the close relationship between living and working conditions and health outcomes has led to a renewed appreciation of how human health is sensitive to the social environment. Factors such as income, education, conditions of employment, power and social support act to strengthen or undermine the health of individuals and communities. Because of their potent and underlying effects, these health-determining factors are known as the 'social determinants of health' (Wilkinson & Marmot 2003).

According to EG White, it is Christ's method and social relations, which provide opportunities for church members to reach out and improve people's health. The benefits are twofold. As activity of church members encourages unity in the commission given to the Seventh-day Adventist Church, it improves the spiritual, nutritional, social, mental, emotional and physical wellbeing of both the members and their local communities.

Thus, ADRA and the health department have been working closely together to improve our local communities' health by addressing one of the social determinants of health referred to as "food insecurity." Food insecurity is when people are unable to access safe, affordable and nutritional food due to the social barriers of cost, transport or availability. As a result, the vegetable food pantry and deliveries in Burnie, Waratah and recently in Smithton commenced.

# **Burnie/Waratah**

Wynyard church member, Maxine Abblitt, and Burnie church member, Raelene Groenewege, weekly bag and deliver fresh produce to Waratah and Burnie community members on behalf of ADRA and their local churches. Since commencing the vegie deliveries, 23 spiritual contacts have developed between Waratah and Burnie. Of these, seven are having bible studies, with the remainder asking questions and showing more interest. Two of these studies are with people who are leaving Satanism and the occult. Hence, they are very keen to get their head space free of anguish, and desire to find peace. Another two contacts are people who are disenfranchised with their home churches. They contacted Maxine out the blue for further information. One lady in Burnie now has her family join in on the bible study. Additionally, next week, a women's group will be commencing in Burnie to further cement friendships. All of these contacts have particular interest in global events and are keen to learn more. Maxine commented that the more they talk and read prophesy the more they understand and want to know.

### Smithton

In May 2019, Smithton church members Pauline Forward, Gwenda Stampton and Yvonne commenced their ADRA food pantry health outreach program, where they bag fresh produce and deliver the produce to 35 contacts in the community every week. A positive result from this new health outreach program has been the recent community volunteer, Briarna, who assists the women with the program. Additionally, Briarna recently completed the Smithton church Depression Anxiety Recovery Program and has embraced positive changes for her mental and spiritual health. On Sunday, November 10, the recipients of the fresh produce were invited to our first community meal to enjoy connecting over a healthy meal.


