Our world church has launched an incredible initiative, and we in Tasmania have a unique part to play in the rollout of OneVoice27. More information and training opportunities are coming soon, and we would love for everyone to get involved. If you have a smartphone, we need your help! Here are 3 key points that summarise what OneVoice27 is:

1. A 2,000-Year Milestone

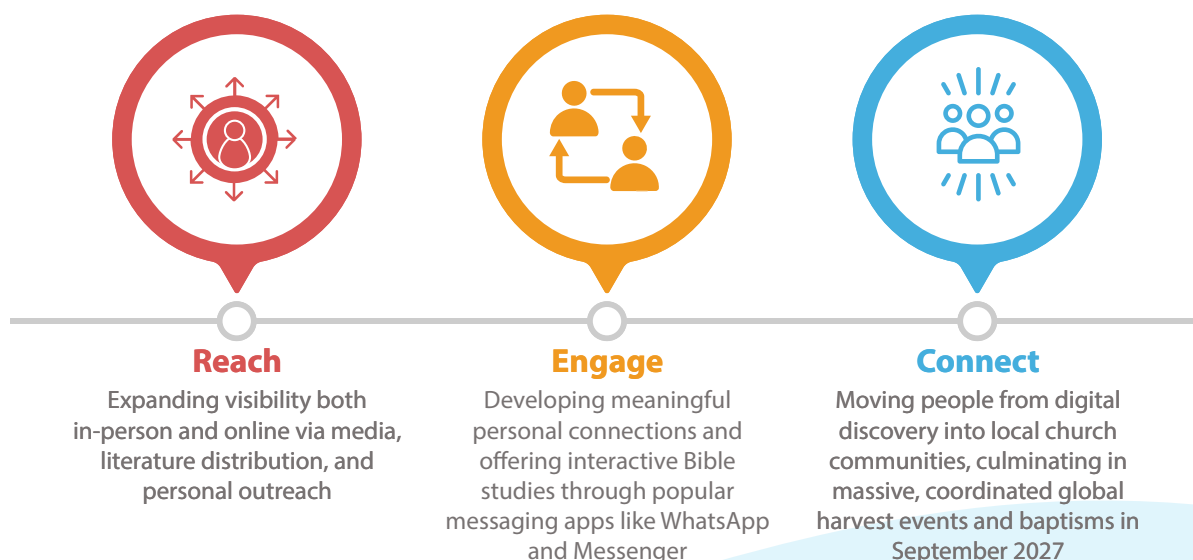
The entire campaign is anchored to a specific historical and prophetic anniversary: 2027 marks exactly 2,000 years since the baptism and anointing of Jesus Christ (which took place in AD 27), launching His public ministry on earth. Our church is leveraging this bimillennial milestone to direct global attention back to Jesus as the true Messiah, connecting the fulfilled prophecies of Daniel with the end-time message of hope found in Revelation.

2. Radical Focus on Digital & Media Evangelism

Recognising that the modern world is increasingly digital and isolated, OneVoice27 shifts the focus from traditional "church maintenance" to active digital missionary work. Under the campaign slogan "All Things New: Hope Starts Here," the initiative aims to turn every member's smartphone into an evangelism tool. The church is hosting global summits to train digital content creators and using massive synchronised media pushes, via Hope Channel, Faith FM, and targeted social media campaigns, to reach billions of people simultaneously.

3. A Simple, Unified Global Strategy (Reach, Engage, Connect)

The campaign seeks to mobilise the church's roughly 24 million members to speak with "one loud voice" by implementing a straightforward, three-step blueprint that can be adapted to any local culture:



OneVoice27 is an initiative that everyone in Tasmania can get excited about. All our local efforts over the next year will serve as a vital stepping-stone toward the upcoming Australia for Christ 2028 movement.

2026 Glenorchy Community & Volunteer Awards in Tasmania

Three long-serving Seventh-day Adventist volunteers have been recognised at the 2026 Glenorchy Community and Volunteer Awards in Tasmania.

Progress and Musings

In the last TASDA I gave you all an indication of the planned future developments at the Campground, and now I can share that the new Transpiration construction has been 'signed off' by Council which will allow our further developments to occur.

Firstly, an application is being developed to allow us to use Thompsons Road as our main entrance, thereby ensuring safer access than using Frankford Road. Along with that we plan to put new signage on the corner of Thompsons Road so that travellers can see that we offer short term RV/caravan stay while waiting to access the Spirit of Tasmania.

Renovations of the facilities are continuing and include:

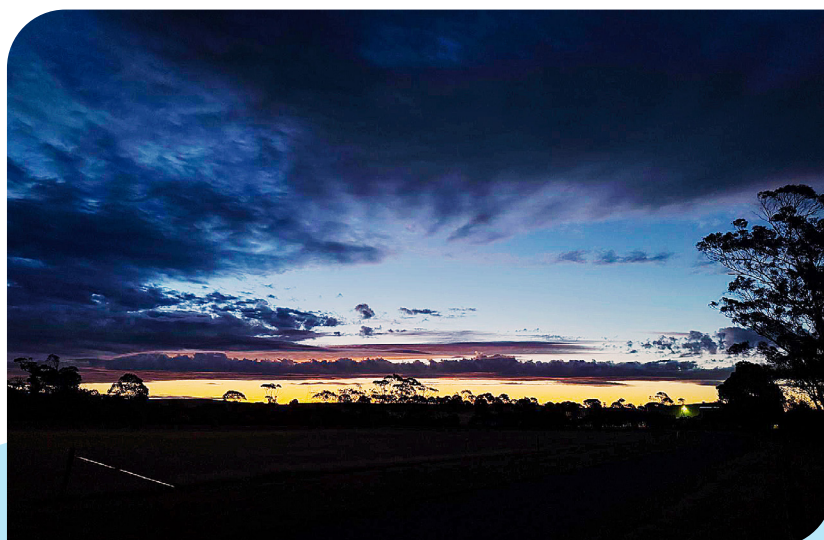
- a new deck being added to the now Managers house which has been completely renovated
- a barn door for disabled toilet access
- a large sandpit using a 5m speedboat
- a 'fort' playground
- gravelling the maintenance area
- new gardens by the 'boom' gate
- commencement of relocating the container adjacent to the JETS shed to the boom gate area for use as the Trust Services Office and traffic coordination
- a laundry 'facelift'
- a modernisation of the current Motel facilities.

We were delighted to host the Wynyard Pathfinders for their recent camp, while also seeing the Devonport Church utilise the dining room for their community health programs.

Week of Worship | The Power of One!

North West Christian School recently had its Week of Worship (**wow**), centred on the theme "The Power of One." This theme aligned with both the school's focus for the year and the Conference theme: "One Family, One Mission, One God."

Throughout the week, students were challenged to consider how one life, one choice, one voice, and one decision can make an eternal difference when placed in God's hands.

We were privileged to have Pastor Travis Siutu, Northern Australian Conference Youth and Ministerial Director, as our guest speaker. His messages were engaging, Christ-centred, and relevant, calling students to a personal relationship with Jesus and a life of purpose and mission.

Creating ONE Community

A significant highlight of this year's **wow** was the decision to combine both Primary and High School students into one united worship experience. This created a unique and powerful sense of oneness across the school.

The combined setting reflected that of a local church environment, where different generations come together in worship. It also opened the door for intentional mentorship, as older students modelled leadership and faith to younger students, fostering a culture of discipleship and belonging.

Student Leaders

At the heart of this year's **wow** was a strong emphasis on student leadership and discipleship development.

Students were actively involved in leading various ministry teams, including:

- Stage and Décor
- Media and Creative Production
- Worship and Band
- Sound and Lighting
- Welcome and Ushering
- Prayer Ministry
- Social and Connection Spaces

Each team was led by students, supported by teachers and pastors who mentored them behind the scenes. This approach empowered students to discover and use their gifts, take ownership of ministry, and step into leadership roles within the school community.

Our Vision: to see students not only participate but lead - both within school and in their local church communities.

The Power of ONE - Decision Cards

The spiritual impact of the week was evident in the response of the students. On the final day, decision cards were distributed to students from Years 3-12, inviting them to respond to God's call.

We rejoice in the following outcomes:

- 55 students chose to follow Jesus
- 42 students expressed interest in Bible studies
- 31 students indicated a desire for baptism
- 49 students committed to being involved in chaplaincy or church activities

In total, 69 decision cards were returned - each representing a young person responding to the prompting of the Holy Spirit.

Is Praying Actually Worth It?

Here are 5 powerful reasons why a praying church is truly unstoppable:

1. It Shifts from Human Effort to Divine Power

A church that does not pray relies on its own talents and budgets. A praying church plugs directly into the power of God. When a congregation stops trying to achieve things in their own limited strength, they unlock supernatural provision and momentum.

2. It Fuels Boldness and Crushes Fear

Throughout history, whenever the church faced intense opposition, prayer was their immediate response. Prayer actively replaces intimidation with Godly confidence. In the book of Acts, when the early church prayed under threat, the place was shaken, and they were filled with the Holy Spirit to speak the word of God with absolute boldness.

3. It Creates Unshakable Unity

Nothing destroys the enemy's plans faster than a unified church, and nothing builds unity faster than corporate prayer. When people gather to pray, petty disagreements, egos, and personal agendas melt away. A church that is perfectly aligned in spirit and purpose cannot be fractured or defeated from the inside out.

4. It Breeds a Supernatural Breakthrough

A praying church doesn't just talk about problems; it assaults spiritual strongholds. Prayer breaks addictions, heals broken relationships, opens doors that looked permanently shut, and brings revival to communities. Where human strategies fail, targeted, persistent prayer forces spiritual breakthroughs.

5. It Keeps Jesus Christ at the Absolute Centre

Constant prayer keeps a church completely humble and deeply connected to its Leader, Jesus Christ. When a church is desperately seeking the face of God, it remains spiritually healthy, vibrant, and entirely aligned with heaven's agenda - making it a force that is unstoppable.

1. Is my prayer life mostly reserved for emergencies or when I suddenly need something from God?
2. Do I regularly spend more time checking my phone or social media in the morning than I do talking to God?

4. Is it easier for me to talk about my problems with friends or counselors than it is to actually take them to God in prayer?
5. Would my spiritual life look exactly the same today if my personal prayer time was completely removed this past week?
6. Are there people in my church that I don't want to talk to because of past issues?
